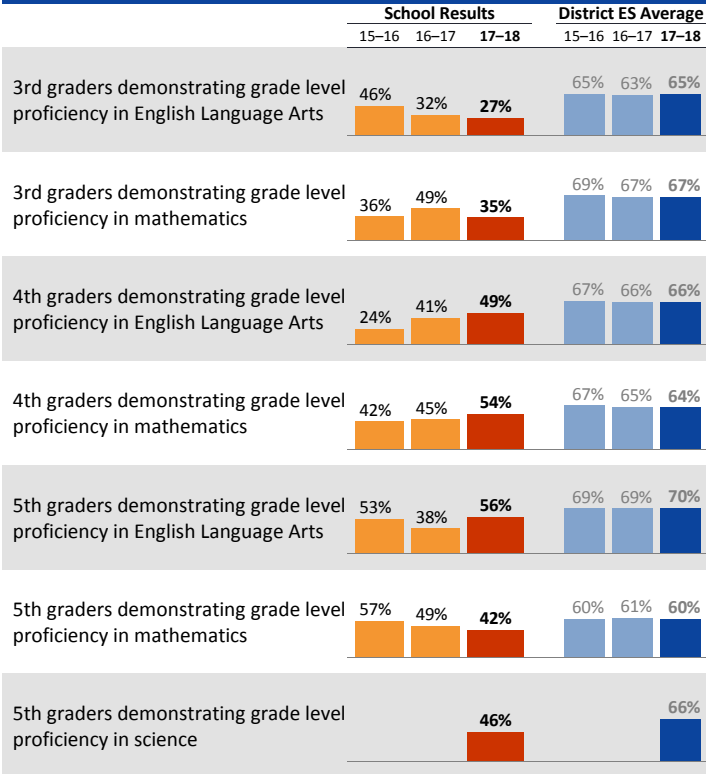

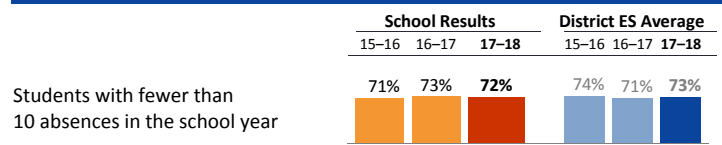

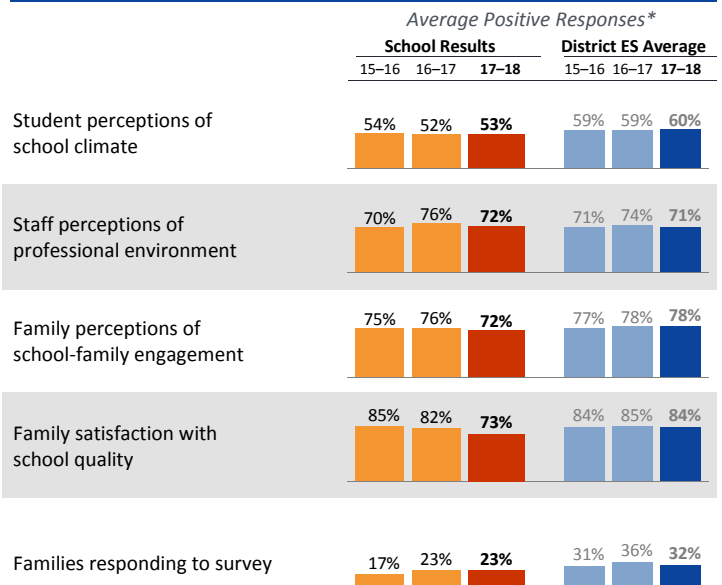

Attendance

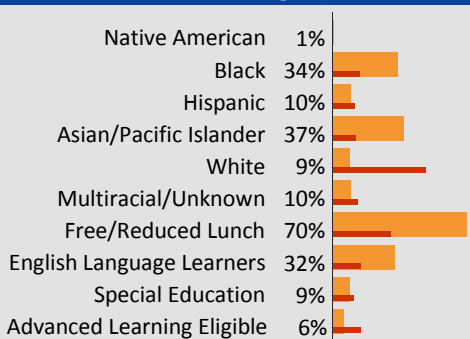


Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

Dearborn Park International School is dedicated to creating an engaging and safe learning community where children are excited about their learning through international education, have pride in their school, are kind and respectful, and celebrate our diversity as global citizens.

School Goals

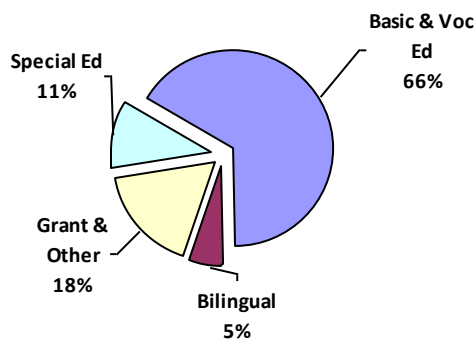
During the 2018-19 school year, strong leadership will result in an increases of 10% or more student achievement as measured in Kindergarten by the WAKids assessment, grades 1-3 on the MAP assessments, and grades 3-5 on the Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA). Through the actions of the Professional Learning Community Teams (PLCs), Building Leadership Team, and Administrative Team, African American students who are served in the intervention block (Tier 2) will increase scores on the Math and ELA SBA by 10%. ELL and Special Education students who are served in the intervention block (Tier 2) in grades 3-5 will increase scores on the Math and ELA SBA by 10%. More than 60% of 3rd–5th grade students will report a positive classroom environment on the Spring 2017 Student Survey.

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

Dearborn Park International School (DPIS) is a mosaic of multiculturalism. As an international school, we focus on academic achievement for all students grounded in world languages, global perspectives, and the development of cultural and global competence. We are a Title 1 school and receive federal dollars to support the learning of our students. We are also a City of Seattle Innovation School and receive city dollars to support a wide variety of academic and non-academic programming for students. Programming at DPIS includes Mandarin and Spanish Immersion, literacy and math intervention, extended learning opportunities in both math and literacy, and social/emotional support that is both school-based and in partnership with community based organizations. At DPIS, we adopt, amend, and differentiate the instruction we facilitate to help all students achieve. Dearborn Park International School is a school that is richly diverse. We celebrate the rich culture and community we have in our neighborhood school. Our student demographics are 35% Black, 9.3% Hispanic, 39.1% Asian, 8.3% White, 8% Multiracial and .3% American Indian. At DPIS, 72% of students receive free and reduced lunch and 37% of our students are English Language Learners. There are 376 students enrolled at Dearborn Park, 27 certificated staff members, and 20 support staff members. Upon leaving Dearborn Park, students will have strong academic skills; good problem-solving skills; a commitment to creating safe, supportive communities; and the ability to take personal responsibility for their actions.
