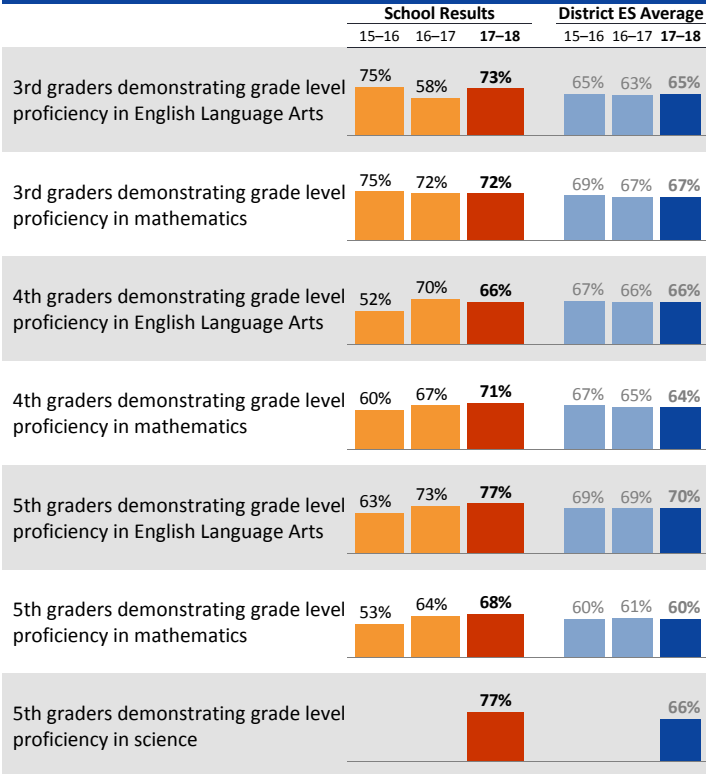

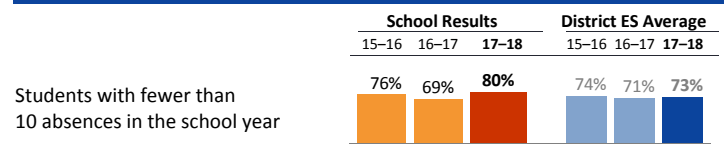

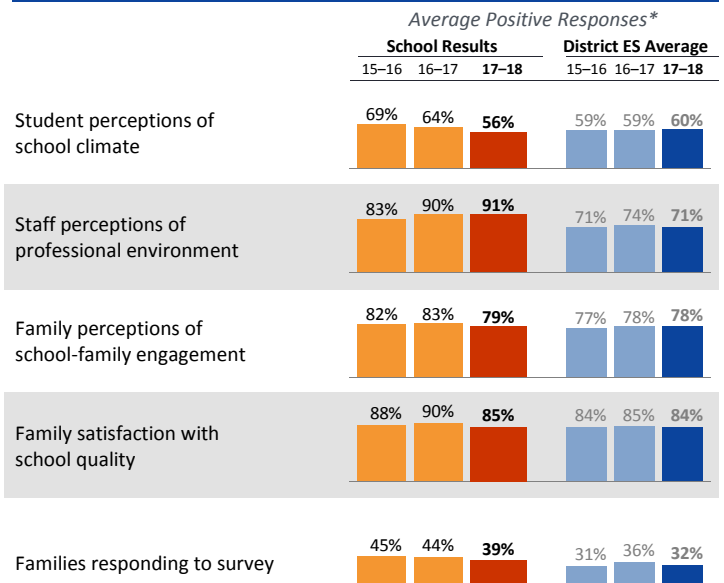

Attendance

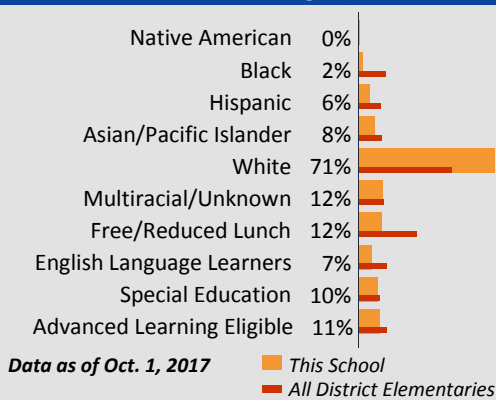


Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

School Goals

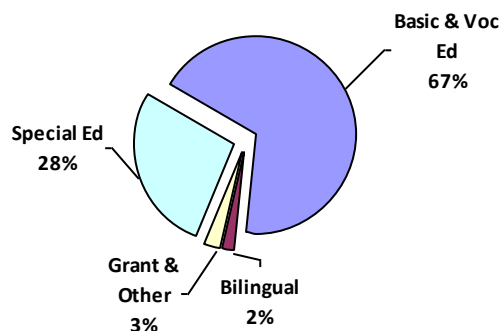

By June 2019, 4th and 5th students receiving ELL services who were not proficient on the 2017 ELA Smarter Balanced Assessment will meet proficiency in at least two strands of the 2018 ELA Smarter Balanced Assessment.

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

Green Lake Elementary is a offers Pre-K - 5 students a welcoming, learning focused environment where students develop positive relationships with their peers and their teachers through engaging classroom instruction that focuses on the whole child. An open concept floor plan throughout the school, provides our teaching staff with the flexibility to utilize the classroom pods for flexible grouping of students and providing students with learning experiences across multiple grade levels. Our staff is committed to strong instructional practices that meet the needs of all learners. Kindergarten is co-taught by three teachers and an Instructional Assistant. Through collaboration, our staff establishes learning goals for students in literacy, math, science, and social studies. Best practices include increasing students' active engagement in their learning and differentiating instruction based on student' readiness. Additionally, we have a large Special Education Team who collaborate with our General Education teachers to provide special designed instruction for students in need of specific medical and/or academic and social supports. In addition to core curriculum in literacy, math, social studies and science all students receive instruction in physical education, art, music, technology, and library studies. Some students also receive swimming, vocal and instrumental music during the year. To support our students in their academic and social success, that staff meets in small teams to monitor student progress and share best instructional practices and systems to support students in the classroom and in school. In addition to dedicated and highly qualified classroom teachers, Green Lake also provides reading and math intervention teachers who support students instructional needs and reduce the class size through the use of flexible small groups. Green Lake Elementary prides itself on family engagement and the strong partnership between Parents and Teachers. The Green Lake PTA is supportive and involved in both school operations.
