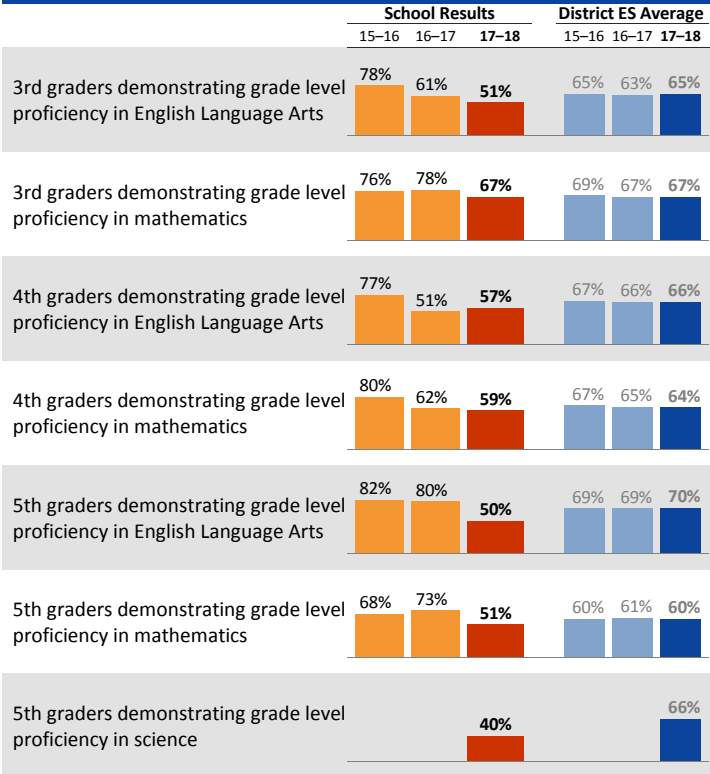

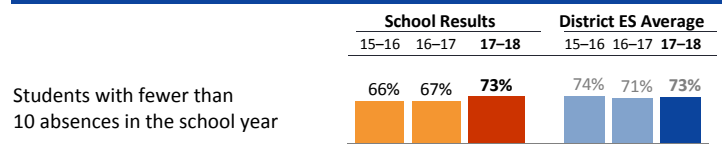

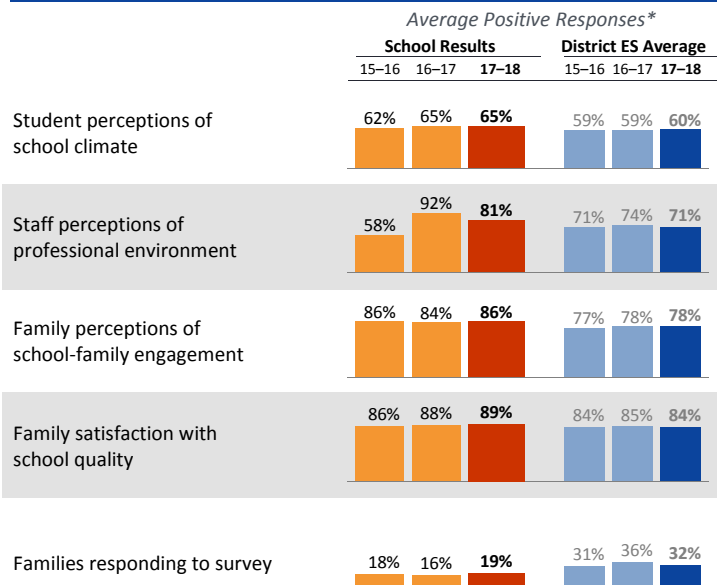

Attendance

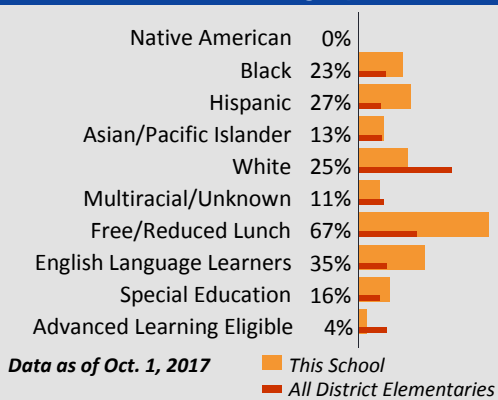


Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

School Mission Statement

Olympic Hills: Where kids and teachers love to learn and grow. We work together to promote academic excellence and inspire lifelong learning. Through a spirit of cooperation, we lead children to be kind, helpful, safe and responsible. We prepare children to be confident learners and critical thinkers.

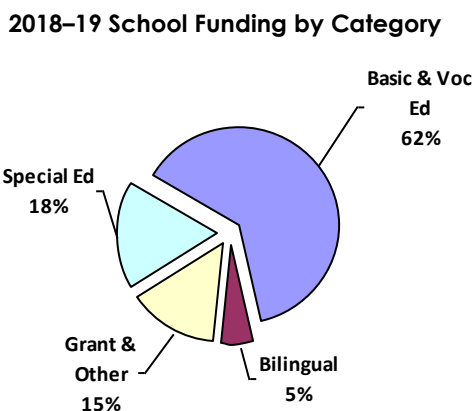
School Goals

SBA: Increase the percent of 3rd-5th graders proficient on math SBA from 60% to 79% and on reading SBA from 57% to 82%. MAP: Increase 1st and 2nd graders meeting or exceeding typical growth on the MAP reading test from 46% to 64%. Gap Closing: Increase the percent of English Language Learners proficient on the reading MAP and SBA by 10% (current gap is over 30%). Attendance: Increase the percent K-5 students with fewer than 5 absences in each semester from 76% to 80%.

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

We are a suburban Title-One school serving the Lake City Neighborhood in Seattle, Washington. We received a Washington State School of Distinction Award based on academic achievement growth in ELA and math for five years. This past year, we received an OSPI Distinguished School Award. We are a diverse community with over 20 languages spoken. We support both highly capable and high-needs learners with a Multi-Tiered System of Supports. We teach Center for the Collaborative Classroom using a workshop model for reading and writing. We also use a workshop model for math to teach content standards and mathematical practices to support independent problem-solvers and critical thinkers. We are a data driven school and use a variety of assessment data to guide instruction and individual supports. We believe in educating the whole child and use the RULER curriculum and Morning Meeting to teach social emotional skills. We receive funds through the Families in Education Levy that are used to provide daily interventions during the school day, extra support for families in need, and an after school program that encompasses tutoring and enrichment experiences. In addition to our emphasis on reading, writing, math and science, students receive supplemental instruction in technology, PE, art, music, and instrumental music.
