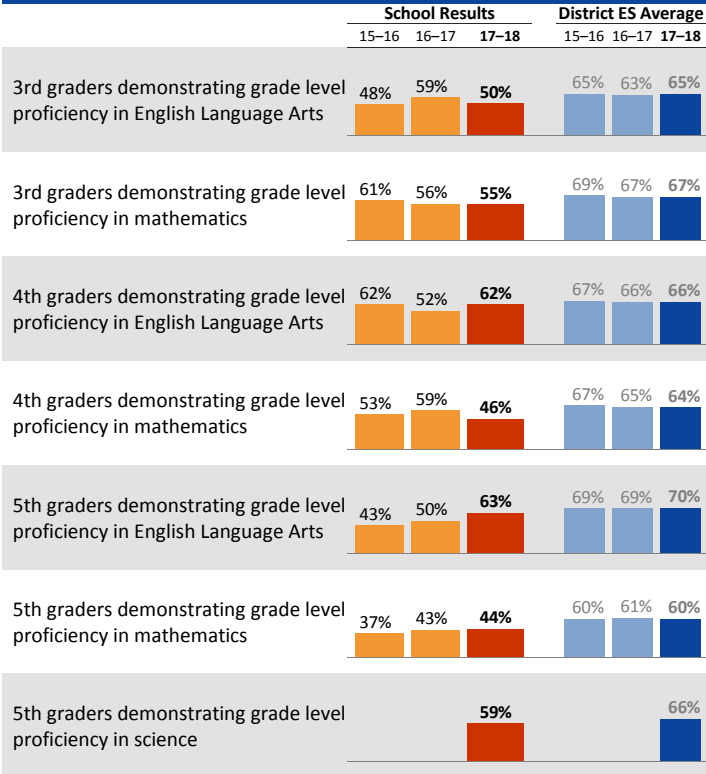

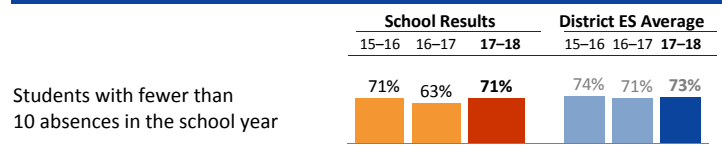

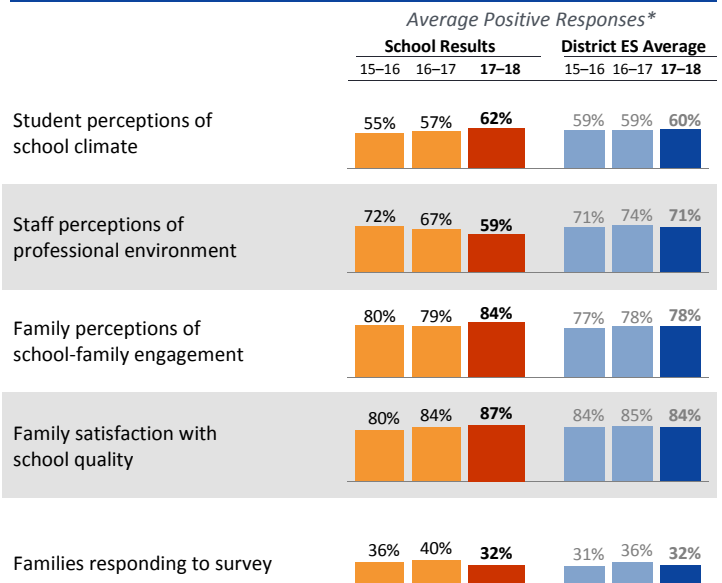

Attendance

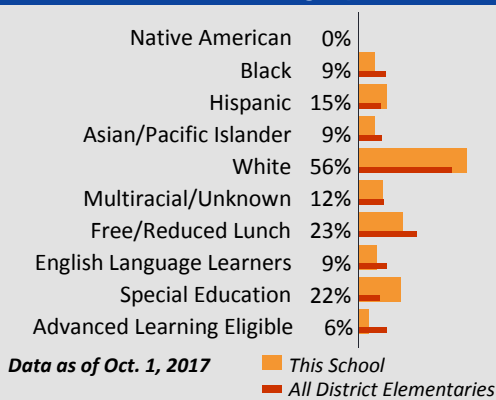


Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

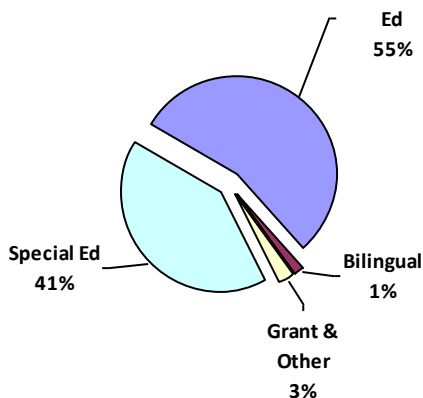
School Mission Statement
 Sacajawea's current working vision is: "Compassionately educating for human greatness as an inclusive community through the arts, high academic expectations, individualized instruction and social and emotional development."

School Goals
 In 2018-19 our academic goals focus on improving outcomes in English Language Arts, with specific concentration on improvement for our African American and Latinx students. We are developing strong core instruction using the Center for the Collaborative Classroom in English Language Arts. In addition, we are working to increase academic outcomes in math for our 5th grade students. Our school culture goal is to increase positive responses to questions about belonging on our Spring student surveys, and we are in our second year of implementation of Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports.

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals
 Sacajawea is a warm, inclusive school with strong family and community ties. As a Special Education Continuum school, we work to ensure that every student is a full community member. Our well-rounded curriculum develops the whole child. We teach pro-social learning through RULER and our SHINE expectations, encouraging students and adults to be Safe, Helpful, Inclusive, Neighborly and Engaged. We create community through Reading Buddies, multi-grade NESTS, and the Roots of Empathy program. In Fourth and Fifth grades, natural sciences are an important learning component. Students participate in IslandWood Environmental Learning Center and Salmon in the Schools. They explore natural features of our neighborhood such as Thornton Creek, Sacajawea Park and the stream we have on our campus. In 2018, we adopted one to one computing for our 3rd-5th graders, and increased technology access for our K-2 students. Art is integrated throughout our curriculum with artists-in-residence, weekly visiting musicians, art classes, and our annual continental focus. Our PTA and Racial Equity Teams sponsor many events, including Literacy Night, Summer Learning Social, Arts Festival, Heritage Potluck, Kindergarten Teddy Bear Picnic, Summer Playdates and Math and Science Night. Additional activities include after school enrichment classes, Instrumental Music, Girls on the Run, School Plays, and Global Reading Challenge.
