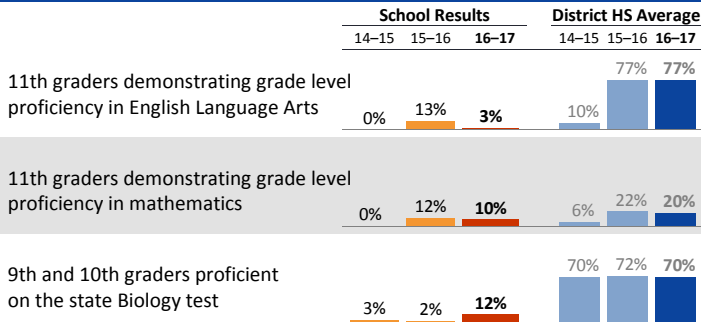

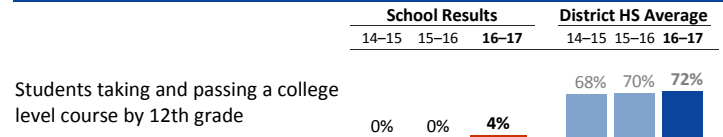

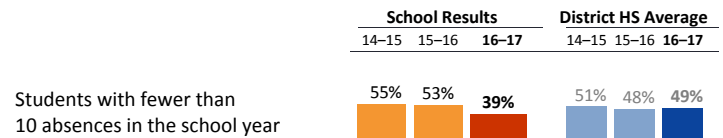

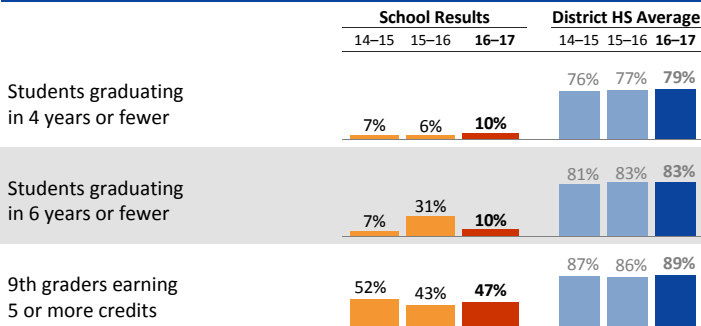

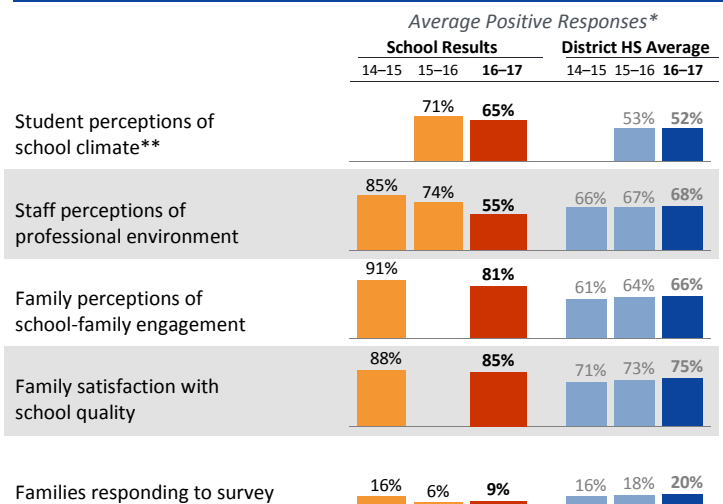
Attendance



On-Track for Graduation



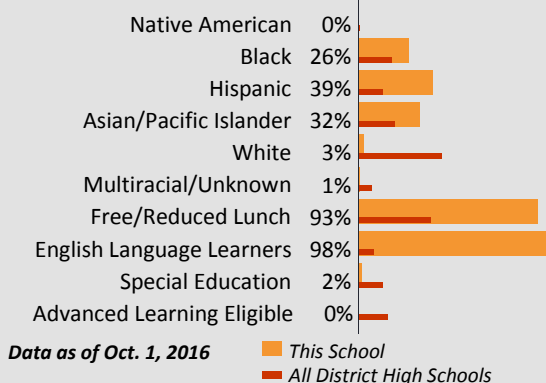
Student, Family, and Staff School Climate Survey

School Goals

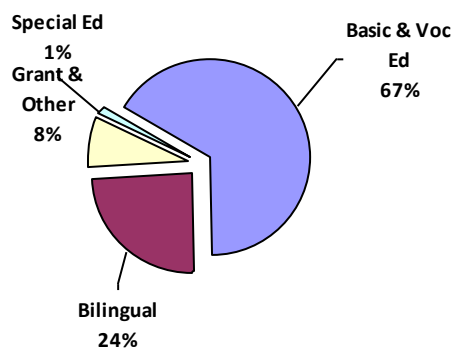
OSPI and SPS Goals for Seattle World School: School Goal #1: 80% of continuously enrolled Level 1 ELL students will advance to middle or high school credit bearing courses within one year as measured by MAP, grades and other program assessments. School Goal #2: 75% of continuously enrollment high school students who entered Fall of 2015 will earn 6.0 high school credits by the end of the year.

School Description & Plan to Achieve Goals

SWS Vision: A school community (grades 6-12) where every student is a life-long learner, culture is celebrated and community is nurtured. Each students is supported for language and academic excellence preparing them for success in college, career and life. Seattle World School Academic Model: 100% of our teaching staff is highly qualified to offer all courses for graduation requirements. 90% of teaching staff are dual endorsed in both ELL and specialized content area. Students are assessed and placed into courses designed to meet their content and language development. Staff is trained in Positive Discipline, Equity, Common Core Standards and ELL strategies. Language Support is provided in more than 12 languages. School teams analyze data and progress monitor student learning in academic, language and social emotional progress. Teachers collaborate with district and other high schools on a regular basis. Holistic support in dental, health, social work, mentoring and career guidance for students. Family Engagement supported through World Family Center and SWS Staff to support school-family partnerships and training. Extended Day Learning (through CBO partners) for after school, Saturday School and summer schools to provide service learning credit, enrichment/arts and academic support.
